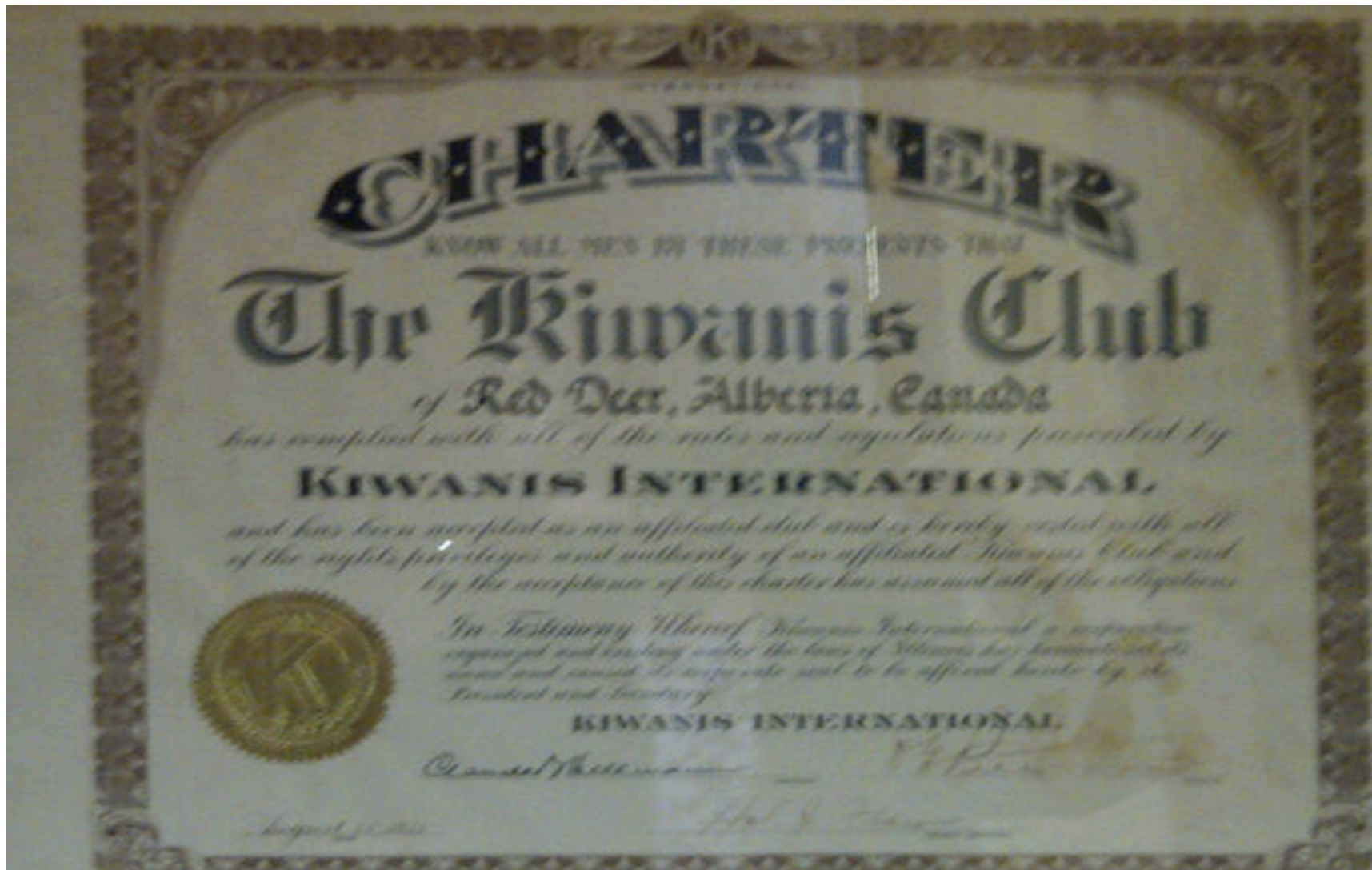
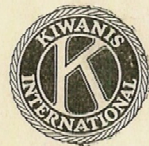

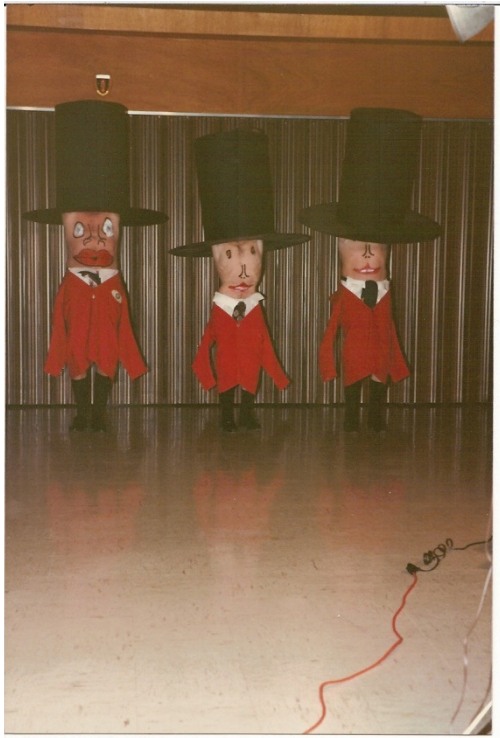
Lieutenant-Governor E. B. Lyle was the genial chairman for the charter night.
